To conclude the 30th anniversary of Galerie Janine Rubeiz, in spite of the difficult regional and local circumstances, we invite you to the opening of "30 Years of Colors", on Thursday, November 30, 2023, from 4 to 8pm. In light of the horrific developments that have struck the people of Palestine and our people in the South of Lebanon, we cannot but persevere in our endeavors to defend our art and culture, and continue to represent the artists who have accompanied us and worked with us over the years.

"30 Years of Colors" is an ode to loyalty and community, to a three-decade journey with our artists, friends, and collectors, who have been with us since 1993, or who have joined us along the way. We are grateful for the longstanding relations we have forged, and we take this opportunity not only to look back and reflect, but to also look forward to supporting more emerging talents, as well as maintaining our growing collective.


During this past year, also as part of the 30-year festivities, we launched "Encounters 2023", an open call followed by a group exhibition, strictly showcasing emerging talents, and facilitating a dialogue between them and the heritage which the older generation of artists has created and exhibited at Galerie Janine Rubeiz. We have been keen on documenting the socio-political changes and how they are reflected through the different practices of artists, since 1993.

Thirty years later, for this special occasion, Nadine Begdache, owner and director of Galerie Janine Rubeiz, with an unwavering vision to keep the gallery an open space for free expression, asked each of our artists to create one artwork inspired by this milestone:

WHAT DO 30 YEARS MEAN IN ONE'S LIFETIME, IN AN ARTIST'S
LIFETIME IN HISTORY? WHAT IS THEIR VISION FOR THE NEXT 30 YEARS?
HOW DOES ONE EVOLVE ON A PERSONAL LEVEL OVER 30 YEARS?
HOW HAVE THE PAST 30 YEARS BEEN IN OUR GEO-POLITICAL CONTEXT?
OUR VERY SPECIFIC LOCATION IN RAS BEIRUT...?

We invite you to discover the resulting exhibition, a mosaic of reflections around this anniversary, from our artists, each from their specific lens.

«Lart et son lieu», a book by Charif Majdalani, accompanied by a visual anthology by Gregory Buchakjian, and retracing the 30-year history of Galerie Janine Rubeiz in its artistic, cultural, and geographic context, will also be launched during the exhibition, on Tuesday, December 12. YVETTE ACHKAR

Born in Sao Paulo, Brazil, in 1928, Yvette Achkar relocated to Lebanon during her upbringing and completed her education at the Lebanese Academy of Fine Arts (ALBA) in 1957. Influenced by Italian painter Fernando Manetti and French painter Georges Cyr, her artistic journey gained momentum during her scholarship-sponsored stay in Paris under the French government's program. Upon her return to Lebanon in 1966, Achkar dedicated herself to teaching painting at ALBA and the Institute of Fine Arts at the Lebanese University until 1988. Her artistic career includes participation in various biennales and numerous solo and group exhibitions across Europe and the Middle East.

Born in Beirut in 1962, Ara Azad Barsoumian, also known as Ara Azad, is an American/Lebanese artist. A graduate of the School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, Tufts University, Medford, and the Institute for Global Leadership (EPIIC 95) in Massachusetts, USA, he currently resides and works in both Boston and Beirut.

DALIA BAASSIRI

Born in 1981, Dalia Baassiri, a versatile multidisciplinary artist, graduated in graphic design from the Lebanese American University in 2003. She pursued a master's degree in Fine Arts at London's Chelsea College of Art and Design, engaging with drawing, painting, and photography. Baassiri's style transcends mediums, showcasing a diverse and expressive approach to art. Her talent was recognized internationally, winning her awards from Fabriano, Maraya, and the Lebanese Web Design Awards. Baassiri's work is permanently featured at Galerie Janine Rubeiz, and her artistry has been highlighted at various esteemed art fairs.

"For an impressive span of three decades, Galerie Janine Rubeiz has firmly planted its roots, emerging as a stalwart beacon that resiliently navigates Lebanon's tumultuous landscape. My artistic expression seeks to mirror the gallery's enduring strength and tenacity. In a deliberate choice, I embarked on the portrayal of a venerable tree, a living testament to resilience that miraculously withstood the destructive force of the Beirut Port blast in Mar Mkhayel.

In the aftermath of that fateful event, this remarkable tree continues to stand tall, its branches reaching for the sky. To further emphasize its triumph over adversity, I've adorned the tree with fragments of wall paint, meticulously stitched onto its trunk and branches. These poignant remnants were carefully collected from the remains of Fayyad Building in 2021, a symbolic act during my active participation in the collective project 'Wajihat.' This initiative aimed to immortalize the collective response to the Port Explosion, uniting the creative endeavors of artists associated with Galerie Janine Rubeiz.

As I paint this narrative of endurance and hope, I am reminded of the gallery's unwavering commitment to artistic expression despite the challenges faced by Lebanon. The resilience embodied by both the gallery and the symbolic tree serves as a testament to the power of art to endure, adapt, and renew in the face of adversity. Through this piece, I hope to convey a message of strength, unity, and the indomitable spirit that defines both Galerie Janine Rubeiz and the vibrant artistic community it fosters."

RACHED BOHSALI

Born in 1957, Rached Bohsali resides and creates art in Beirut. As a professor at the Lebanese American University, he once led the Fine Arts and Foundation Studies Department. He earned a Bachelor of Architecture from the American University of Beirut in 1981 and a C.E.A.A. (Post Diploma) in Domestic Architecture from the Beaux-Arts in Paris (Ecole d'Architecture Paris-Villemin) in 1984. His artistic style defies easy categorization, reflecting a diverse range of influences. Bohsali's work seamlessly blends abstraction, realism, and symbolism, showcasing his versatility and willingness to explore various artistic approaches.

ELIE BOURGELY

Born in Lebanon in 1960, Elie Bourgely pursued his artistic journey through studies at the Institute of Fine Arts at the Lebanese University, furthering his exploration in plastic arts at the Ecole Nationale des Beaux-Arts in Paris. He earned a master's degree in Art History at the Sorbonne Paris IV, accompanied by a DEA and a doctorate. His work eludes easy categorization, as it artfully synthesizes a rich tapestry of influences and genres. His art delves into the interruption of time, almost accidentally assembling debris into a material tapestry, echoing an archaeological instinct. Everyday materials morph into lost and found objects, punctuating temporality with strange, disjointed sequences. Bourgely's practice seeks to expose the haunted in daylight, piecing the world together in a new continuum of histories and objects.



JOSEPH CHAHFE

Born in Beirut in 1959 and relocated to Montreal in 1980, Joseph Chahfe earned a degree in visual multimedia arts from Quebec University of Montreal (UQAM) in 1987. His artistic style is marked by a profound exploration of materials, recognizing their historical significance in the realm of art. Chahfe's work reimagines materials as expressive mediums, forming a dialogue between humanity and culture, deeply intertwined with memory. His canvases resemble urban walls or ancient palimpsests, capturing the unpredictable nature of time and everyday life. His recent work delves into the concept of origins, using the barcode as a metaphor for the constraints imposed by political realities of identity and citizenship.

PETRAM CHALACH

Born in 1988 in Ashrafieh, Lebanon, Petram Chalach is a self-taught visual artist currently residing and working in his hometown. His diverse artistic practice encompasses painting, ceramics, photography, and digital art. Chalach's works have gained recognition through solo and group exhibitions in Beirut, and they have become part of private collections in Lebanon, Amsterdam, and France. Notable exhibitions include "Darkside" at Babel Theatre in 2015, "Decay of Lying" at KED Beirut in 2018, and "The Mourning after" at ARTLAB Beirut in 2019. Beyond traditional venues, Chalach explores unconventional spaces in independent collective exhibitions like "Bala Manyake III," contributing dynamically to the cultural landscape of Beirut.

DINAH DIWAN

Born in Beirut, Lebanon in 1962, Dinah Diwan lives and works between Paris and Los Angeles. At the break of the civil war, in 1975, she moved to Italy then later to France to join her family. Trained as an architect, she graduated from the École Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture de Paris . Diwan's art deploys references to architectural and urban elements such as neighbourhood plans, gardens and maps. Her art practice includes techniques of painting, collages with illegible writing on paper, canvas, fabric, frosted glass, and embroidery. Diwan's work has been exhibited at Galerie Janine Rubeiz in Beirut, Esther Woerdehoff Gallery in Paris, Over The Influence in Los Angeles and several art fairs in Paris, Abu Dhabi, Beirut.

BASSAM GEITANI

Born in Lebanon in 1962, Bassam Geitani currently resides and works in Lebanon after spending fourteen years in Paris. He holds a master's degree in art from the University of Paris I-Sorbonne and teaches fine art at the Lebanese American University. Geitani's artistic style spans painting, installation, film, and performance. His work delves into the exploration of materiality and surface, incorporating elements from different symbolic realms. This artistic exploration results in a dynamic interplay between material properties and organic arrangements on canvas. Influenced by scientific concepts like Foucault's pendulum, Geitani's art embraces fluidity while retaining a fully formed structure.

"Reflets de Mon Passage: Quatre œuvres Inspirés de mes Propres Expositions à la Galerie Janine Rubeiz"

La Galerie Janine Rubeiz célèbre son 30e anniversaire avec une exposition spéciale, et j'ai le privilège d'y contribuer en exposant quatre de mes œuvres. Mes créations, mesurant 30x30 cm chacune, sont inspirées de trois expositions antérieures qui ont marqué mon parcours artistique et reflètent ma vision artistique unique.

La première œuvre est issue de mon exposition intitulée "Psychologie de la Matière" en 1998, c'est une exposition qui explore plus en profondeur les aspects psychologiques des matériaux dans l'art. Elle va au-delà de l'esthétique superficielle et plonge dans les dimensions émotionnelles et conceptuelles que les matériaux peuvent évoquer.

La deuxième œuvre s'inspire de mon exposition intitulée "Sueurs d'Acier "en 2007. C'est une exposition qui utilise la rouille de fer pour représenter les traces des mouvements tectoniques sur la toile. Elle offre une perspective artistique sur les forces géologiques et invite les spectateurs à contempler la beauté et la fragilité de notre environnement en constante évolution.

La troisième œuvre trouve son inspiration dans l'exposition "Shathaya" en 2015. Cette exposition était centrée sur les 99 noms de Dieu et combinait la calligraphie avec des miroirs coniques anamorphiques. C'est une tentative de cacher, d'envelopper et de pleurer la pureté de la religion.

La quatrième "War Victims ", en 2013 est une installation murale qui utilise du métal rouillé découpé en calligraphie libre. Cette calligraphie est réfléchie sur un miroir conique, créant ainsi une œuvre d'art visuellement saisissante. L'installation explore le thème des victimes de guerres et suscite une réflexion profonde sur cette réalité humaine complexe.

En exposant ces quatre œuvres à la Galerie Janine Rubeiz, je suis honoré de contribuer à cet événement spécial qui célèbre trois décennies d'art et de créativité. J'espère que mes œuvres captureront l'essence des expositions antérieures et susciteront une réflexion profonde et une appréciation esthétique chez les visiteurs.

Que cette célébration marque le début d'une nouvelle décennie d'inspiration artistique à la Galerie Janine Rubeiz, et je tiens à féliciter Nadine Begdache pour son engagement continu envers les artistes et la promotion de l'art.

RENOZ

Born in Tyre, Lebanon, in 1994, Renoz (Ahmad Ghaddar) is a Beirut-based multidisciplinary artist with a BA in Fine Arts from the Lebanese University. Since 2014, he has immersed himself in graffiti, drawing inspiration from diverse sources, exploring culture, history, and politics.

Renoz's murals, including large-scale ones, feature birds as a recurring motif symbolizing freedom and migration. During the October revolution, his work resonated strongly, sparking engagement and dialogue, leading him to explore social-political influences across a broader range of issues.

Beyond graffiti, Renoz dedicates time to studio work and printmaking. He has been part of group exhibitions at Galerie Janine Rubeiz since 2019. In 2022, with the support of the British Arts Council, he presented his first solo show, "Lawen Wasel," at ArtLab, Beirut.



Born in Lebanon in 1970, Mansour El Habre is a multidisciplinary artist known for his work in painting, printmaking, and new media. He earned a BFA from the Lebanese University and an MFA from the University of Balamand. Currently, El Habre serves as an instructor at the Lebanese Academy of Fine Arts (ALBA). His artistic style features strong thematic elements, dynamic human figures, and distinctive geometric shapes unified by vivid colors. In his paintings and works on paper, human forms transform into sharp lines and fluid figures, creating captivating compositions where subjects seem to be in perpetual motion, evading the confines of the canvas.





JOSEPH HARB

Born in Lebanon in 1964, Joseph Harb holds a Bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the Lebanese University. He is a conscious practitioner of abstraction, with a focus on the fundamental relationship between images and objects. His art explores the possibilities of line and color, resulting in compositions that intermingle memory and unconsciousness. While he incorporates figurative elements, they function as aesthetic signals within a closed system. Harb's work exists at the intersection of realism and abstraction, revealing and obscuring simultaneously, creating a visual experience that transcends traditional painting.



Born in 1961 in Tripoli, Zeina Kamareddine Badran is a distinguished Lebanese painter, artist-printmaker, and instructor at the American University of Beirut and Lebanese American University. Zeina's artistic journey includes studies in art at LAU and obtaining certificates in Lithography, Etching, and Silkscreen from the Lebanese Academy of Arts (ALBA). She has further enriched her skills through workshops in London and Casablanca-Morocco. Zeina Kamareddine Badran has showcased her art globally through solo exhibitions and numerous collective exhibitions, including the 20th International Biennale of Engraving in Sarcelles, France (2021), 'Voices From Lebanon' in Cincinnati, USA (2019), 'IT'S LIQUID Group' International Art Expo in Venice (2016), ART15-London (2014), Beirut Art Fair (2016, 2015, 2014), and Salon D'automne at Sursock Museum in Beirut (2010, 2009, 2008, 2007, 2006, 2003). Her artistic contributions extend to significant art fairs like Beirut Art Fair and exhibitions at Athr gallery in Jeddah, KSA, reflecting her impactful presence in the international art scene.

Born in 1982, Christine Kettaneh, a Lebanese artist with a finance and economics background, holds a Master of Fine Arts from Central Martins College of Art and Design. Christine's interdisciplinary exploration involves collaborations with physicists, climate scientists, linguists, dancers, and management consultants. Currently, she serves as the guest artist in "Global Climate Lab 2," an immersive research lab fostering collaboration between climate researchers and artists, addressing emotions often overlooked by scientific methods. Christine has engaged in various artist residencies, showcasing her work in individual and collective exhibitions in Lebanon and internationally. Her accolades include The Art Rights Prize 'Partner Prize Award' by Isorropia Homegallery, Milan (2021); 'Audience Award' in the Berlin Revolution Film Festival (2020); 'Best Experimental Short Film' in the Mediterranean Film Festival Cannes (2018); YICCA - art residency in Italy - prize (2018); Premio Ora Prize (2017); Aomi Okabe Jury award in Art Olympia, Tokyo (2017); and the Arte Laguna Prize in Sculpture and Installation, Venice (2015).



"I captured the footage for this film during my solo show at Galerie Janine Rubeiz in 2017. The footage documents the installation of 'Sugar Ball,' a ball I crafted with sugar, continuously rolling on the table's surface through a concealed mechanism. Through the film, 'Being Here,' I aim to commemorate the kinetic installation showcased at the gallery and reflect on my journey through it."



CHARLES KHOURY

Born in 1966, Charles Khoury, a Lebanese artist known for his vibrant color palette, explores a distinct realm of interiors with a radical formalist perspective. His art, rooted in Lebanon's rich tradition, innovatively bridges image and meaning. Khoury, an ALBA graduate since 2005, teaches fine arts at Saint Joseph School Antoura since 1993. His legacy, undeniably Modernist, unfolds in exhibitions globally and is permanently showcased at Galerie Janine Rubeiz. Symmetry and primal forms in his works create playful intersections, while sculptures employ precise mathematical processes, achieving irreverent monumentality. Khoury's art blends bodies into abstract, gravitationally charged spaces, challenging traditional representations.

JAMIL MOLAEB



Holding a master's degree from Pratt Institute in New York and a PhD in Art Education from the University of Ohio, Molaeb has a rich academic background. ZAD MOULTAKA

Born in 1967, Zad Moultaka, a composer and visual artist, shifted from Lebanon to Paris in 1984. Winning the First Prize at the Conservatoire National Superieur de Paris in 1989, he later left his international interpreting career in 1993 to focus on composition and visual art.

Moultaka's global visual arts career includes exhibitions at notable venues. In 2021, Maison Louis Vuitton chose him to design a trunk for its founder's 200th birthday. Private collectors and institutions, like the Boghossian Foundation and Centre Pompidou-Metz, have acquired his works.

Rooted in the Mediterranean, Moultaka creates a unique musical language, recognized by György Kurtág. Awards include the SACEM Prize and Critics' Prize for "UM sovereign engine of all things."

His opera portfolio includes works at Festival Berlioz, Opéra national du Rhin, and Compagnie Lyrique de Création Chants Libres. Moultaka has received numerous global musical commissions.



GRETA NAUFAL

Born in 1955, Greta Naufal is a Lebanese visual artist and art educator. She studied painting under John Guvder in 1967 and later at l'Académie Libanaise des Beaux-Arts under the tutelage of pioneering Lebanese modern artists. She earned her Master's degree in Fine Arts with distinction in 1980. Her artwork spans various mediums, including painting, collage, drawing, photography, lithography, video, and installations. Her early work reflects an expressionist style influenced by the Lebanese Civil War, while later pieces focus on documenting postwar Beirut's architectural heritage and exploring human conditions through portraits of notable figures. Greta Naufal is also a dedicated art educator, mentoring emerging artists in Lebanon.




MOHAMAD EL RAWAS

Born in 1951 in Beirut, Mohammad El Rawas is a Lebanese artist celebrated for his resilience amidst the challenges of the civil war. Despite interruptions, he graduated with honors in painting from the Lebanese University in 1975. After teaching art in Morocco for two years, he returned to Beirut in 1979, marking the beginning of a prolific career.

El Rawas has exhibited extensively with twelve solo shows in Beirut, London, and Dubai, including notable displays at the Janine Rubeiz gallery. His international presence is underscored by participation in over 40 global art events, earning him five prizes, including the 2007 prize at the Alexandria Biennial for his innovative installation, "Sit down Please!"

Featured in museums and public collections across the globe, El Rawas's artistic legacy reflects resilience and innovation in the face of adversity.

AIDA SALLOUM

Born in 1954 in Kab Elias, Bekaa, Lebanon, Aida Salloum is a renowned artist known for her vibrant landscapes. After earning a Fine Arts degree from the Lebanese University, she pursued a postgraduate diploma from the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik and has been an Assistant Professor of Fine Arts at the Lebanese University since 1998. Initially inspired by the Bekaa valley, her art transformed as she moved to Beirut in 1977, evolving through different phases influenced by the Lebanese civil war. Her work reflects inner reflections and deep emotions, with recent exhibitions at Galerie Janine Rubeiz exploring notions of light through abstract color weaving. Salloum's evolving aesthetic experience is evident in her latest solo exhibition at Galerie Janine Rubeiz in February 2022.



FRANÇOIS SARGOLOGO

Born in Lebanon in 1955, François Sargologo's art is a distant allegory, centered on his hometown, Beirut, from an exiled perspective. His photography from wartime evokes a world both imagined and lost, set in soberly lyrical environments. Through minimal vocabulary, he seeks language in a world of alienation, emphasizing objects torn from their context to signify everyday significance and life's transience. Sargologo's focus on still lifes reshapes space, allowing submerged narratives to briefly emerge, illuminating societal and political spheres. His art creates reverberations, where the signified appears lost, but a faint glimmer of meaning persists. Currently residing and working in Paris, Sargologo's interdisciplinary work spans painting, photography, and installation, earning him the European Print Award of Excellence in London.

His artistic style primarily encompasses surface paintings, initially appearing as abstractions but revealing the physical scars of conflict. His work delves into memory, exile, and healing, navigating the past, present, and future, often with a connection to the history of Lebanon and the Middle East. Srouji's art has found its place in notable public and private collections worldwide.

She holds a master's degree in marketing and communication from the Ecole Superieure des Affaires in Beirut and a master's degree in fine arts from the Lebanese University. Stephan's artistic style revolves around paper and mixed media on wood, earning recognition both locally and internationally. Her work delves into the realms of memory, encompassing cultural, historical, and traumatic aspects. It begins with flowers and patterns, capturing the uncertainties and instabilities of Lebanon's wartime through meticulous marks, eventually evolving into minimal art infused with personal warmth and anxiety. Stephan's art speaks to the personal and intimate, where symmetrical rupture symbolizes the human condition under duress.

FAYÇAL SULTAN

Born in 1946 in Tripoli, Lebanon, Fayçal Sultan is a renowned artist and educator. Graduating with a Diploma in High Studies in Drawing and Painting from the Fine Arts Institute at the Lebanese University in 1973, he went on to earn a Diploma in Profounded Studies in Plastic Art (DEA) and a PhD in Plastic Arts from Paris University VIII in 1985 and 1988, respectively. Sultan's impact on the Lebanese art scene is profound; he has been a syndicate member, a professor at the Fine Arts Institute of the Lebanese University since 1976, and actively involved in various art associations. As an esteemed art critic, his writings have enriched newspapers such as "Mulhak Al-Nahar" since 1994. Beyond his role as an educator and critic, Sultan is a versatile artist, with a robust exhibition history dating back to 1972, featuring significant showcases in Beirut, Paris, Kuwait, and beyond. His contributions stand as a testament to his enduring influence on the arts.

LARA TABET


Born in 1983, Lara Tabet, a Lebanese visual artist and pathologist, completed her Clinical Pathology residency at the American University of Beirut Medical Center in 2012. She furthered her artistic pursuits with a one-year program at the International Center of Photography in New York, earning the Lisette Model scholarship. Tabet's art, influenced by her pathology background, explores the legacy of trauma in Lebanon. Her recent work delves into the connection between individuals and public/private spaces, addressing themes of gender, sexuality, and identity. Tabet's photography, seemingly mundane yet deeply metaphorical, examines the interplay between the individual and the collective, utilizing meticulous documentation, rephotography, staging, and manipulation, all rooted in a sense of amnesia. In her latest series, "Underbelly," Tabet subverts gender roles by offering a female gaze on representations of violent hypersexualization against women's bodies.

contextualizes "The Return of the Old Man to His Youth for Vigor and Coitus," an Ottoman book written in the 16th century by the religious scholar Ahmed Ibn Suleiman, aiming to revitalize Sultan Selim's dwindling sexuality. This unique book encompasses voluptuous teachings, as well as remedies and potions designed to enhance sexual pleasure. The medical component of the book draws on humoral theory, initially proposed by Hippocrates and later embraced by al-Râzî, which posits that the body's well-being hinges on the equilibrium of its four humors or liquids—blood, phlegm, yellow bile, and black bile—while illnesses result from their imbalance.

Trained as a medical doctor herself, Tabet reappropriates the figure of the healer by enacting various erotic recipes and creating visual interpretations through the reaction of medicinal plants and food spices with photosensitive photographic paper, employing a technique known as the chemigram. The work strives to decolonize and queer health practices and beliefs associated with the body, sexuality, and gender by reconnecting with ancient and indigenous knowledge concerning plants and body rituals.

The accompanying video features a slow edit of morphing chemigrams, blown out of scale in a multiscalar correspondence between the microscopic and macroscopic worlds. The soundtrack of the video is based on the data sonification of the active ingredients of the recipes and the body parts they affect, providing a sensory dimension to the exploration of historical and sensual elements within the project.

ALAIN VASSOYAN

Born in 1966, Alain Vassoyan, a Lebanese-Canadian sculptor in Beirut, studied at the Ecole de Ceramique Bonsecours in Montreal. Currently teaching at ALBA and Saint Joseph University, his three-dimensional installations are globally acclaimed.

Solo exhibitions at "Salle du Gesu" in Montreal (1995) and Galerie Janine Rubeiz in Beirut ("Djoudou City" - 2009, "Labyrinthe d'Oiseaux" - 2011, "Reconstruire Venus" - 2017) showcase his artistic journey. His works have featured in worldwide collective exhibitions, including "Sursock Museum" in Beirut (2006 and 2018) and "Beirut Art Fair" (2012-2015).

In 2005, Vassoyan contested in the international competition at "Hyogo Prefector Museum" in Kobe, Japan. Renowned for his sculptural prowess, his works find a permanent home at Galerie Janine Rubeiz.



Born in Shmestar in 1980, Lebanese artist Ghada Zoghbi embarked on her artistic journey at 18, moving to Beirut to pursue art teacher training. In 2010, she obtained a Fine Art degree from the Lebanese University. Influenced by Lucian Freud's expressionism and Rembrandt's mastery of light, Zoghbi's art revolves around the profound interplay between personal and communal aspects. Primarily focusing on oil paintings, her debut solo exhibition, "Regimes of the Personal," served as a catalyst. She continued to explore the connection between individuals and their environments through numerous collective exhibitions and international art fairs, refusing to be constrained by political or religious affiliations and aiming to unite people through her art. Additionally, as an art teacher for two decades, Zoghbi has enriched the educational experiences of various young students, including inner-city children and refugees in Lebanon.
